DVR Meeting February 13, 2012 Health Careers Minutes

1. Health Careers Articulation/Dual Credit

- a. Susan Collins outlined the courses that are currently available for dual credit. These currently include the following:
 - i. Introduction to Health Careers
 - ii. Essentials of Medical Terminology
 - iii. Ethics and Law for the Allied Health Major
 - iv. Basic Nurse Assistant
 - v. Hazardous Materials (Fire Science)
 - vi. Fire Protection (Fire Science)
 - vii. First Responder
 - viii. Introduction to Eye Care (not currently offered)
 - ix. Ocular Disease
 x. Optical Principles
 xi. Opthalmic Skills I
 xii. Opthalmic Skills II
 xiii. Opthalmic Office Procedures
 - xiv. Care of Patients of Alzhiemers "
 - xv. Intro to Home Health Nursing Aide (not currently offered)
- b. Susan also discussed the requirements to enter the CNA program. Those include the following: valid social security number, at least 16 years old, and a reading score of 4 or more on Triton's placement test. Students will require a criminal background check, fingerprinting, and provide proof of health insurance. Students may also obtain health insurance through student health.
- c. Other programs discussed were Surgical Tech which offers a certificate; all other programs offer an AAS degree including Diagnostic Sonography, Nuclear Medicine, Nursing, Radiologic Technology, and Ophthalmic Technician Program.
- d. Students may finish their bachelor's degree in nursing through Illinois Benedictine who holds their courses on the Triton campus.
- e. Susan shared the concept behind the Allied Health Programs of Study. (attached)

2. Technology

- a. Triton uses Blackboard as a shell for all of their courses.
- b. Triton uses e-books when possible, and the nursing program uses some ebooks along with some hard copy textbooks.
- c. Students have the opportunity to check out laptops for various amounts of time.
- d. Triton is constantly evolving to become more green.

3. Success of dual credit students

- a. Overall the students are thriving.
- b. Work ethics can present challenges for some dual credit students. Those include the following:
 - i. Tardies/absenteeism
 - ii. Failure to complete coursework in a timely fashion
 - iii. Texting and cell phone use during class
- c. Students must maintain an 80% average to stay in the Nurse Assistant program.
- d. Reading level seems to be a good indicator of potential success in health careers programs.
