### <u>Riverside-Brookfield (Mike Reingruber)</u>

- Administered the "Do What You Are" Personality Inventory from Naviance to sophomores.
- Created a plan of study and electives they can take in each of the 16 Career Clusters and put this information in our curriculum guide.
- In the process of adding to the plan of study- colleges that are well known for each
  of the Career Clusters and putting a direct link to the Most Selective, Highly
  Selective, and Selective colleges that offer these programs on the RiversideBrookfield website.
