Triton College Updates

We reviewed the policies and process for Dual Credit courses at Triton. Ridgewood is working with Triton. Karen mentioned the Cece Samp is very helpful with dual class paperwork.

Dr. William Griffin communicated that Triton has a new center developed by him in partnership with local business leaders and organizations, The Innovation and Entrepreneurship Center will host industry experts that will provide support, advice and ongoing services for small and medium businesses throughout the area.
