Career Based Activities Multiple Schools Participated in:

Ridgewood (Jim Gyori)

- All Freshman students participated in a career "Gallery Walk" where they explored two career clusters and three specific careers within those clusters. They completed Xello Career Surveys. Completed "Reality Check Survey" through DePaul University. Completed a personal reflection on their preferred career path then used their personal reflection to guide their elective choices for their sophomore year.

- All sophomores and all juniors participated in a two day career exploration unit guided by counselors during their English periods.
- All sophomores and all juniors had individual registration meetings with their counselor. Counselors used this time to draw connections between their student's career paths and their individual post high school college/career plan.
- "Career Expo Evening," an evening event open to all students, families and community members. This evening allowed attendees to select three 20 minute career presentations of their choice. The format allowed attendees to ask individual questions of current professionals regarding the professional's personal career path.

Riverside Brookfield (Mike Reingruber)

- After completing Do What You Are and the Career Interest Profiler, students complete an information sheet they go over with their counselor, detailing their career interests and college majors they may want to explore for that career.
- Administration has created a Career and Internship Committee to help with planning of a career fair, career spotlights, and continuing to explore ways to introduce students to career options, as well as help them explore internship possibilities.

West Leyden (Marijana Uremovic)

- -Had a week where there were numerous breakout sessions for seniors including trade-schools and other non-college post secondary options.
- -Junior Jump Start is an evening geared towards all juniors and their families. We have speakers, in both Spanish and English, representing all possible pathways from 4 year college to the military to trades.
- -All Freshman, Sophomores and Juniors took YouScience.
- YouScience combines objective measures of aptitudes (natural abilities most important to career choice) with interests to match talent with best-fit, in-demand careers.
