JOB ZONE

Education -

Most occupations in this zone require training in vocational schools, related on-the -job experience, or an associate's degree.

Experience -

Previous work-related skill, knowledge, or experience is required for these occupations. For example, completing three or four years of apprenticeship or several years of vocational training, and often must have passed a licensing exam, in order to perform the job.

Training -

Employees in these occupations usually need one or two years of training involving both on-the-job experience and informal training with experienced workers. A recognized apprenticeship program may be associated with these occupations.
